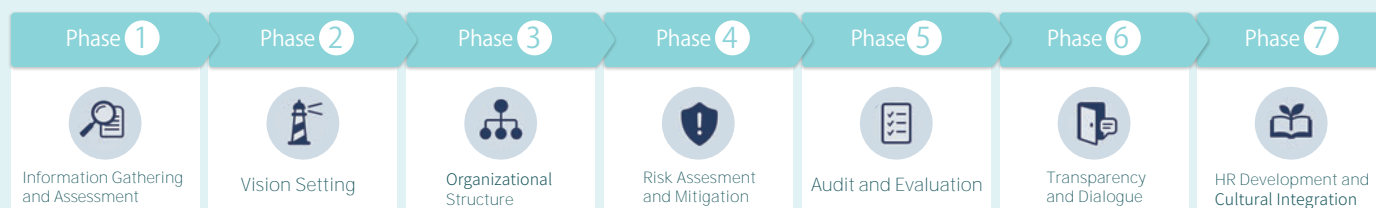

What's HAIP?

The Hiroshima AI Process (HAIP) is an international governance framework led by the OECD, launched following the G7 Hiroshima AI Summit, as a practical example of enhancing transparency. It is designed as a platform for cooperation and trust, enabling AI developers and providers to share practices and learn across national and regulatory boundaries.
